



Allied Healthcare Loan Repayment Program (AHLRP) for CMSP Counties

This program will be funded by the County Medical Services Program (CMSP) Governing Board. Eligible applicants may receive loan repayments of up to \$16,000 per year in exchange for a one-year service obligation practicing direct patient care at one of the CMSP qualified and contracted facilities or clinics in any of the 35 CMSP designated counties*.

The application cycle will be open August 1, 2018 – October 9, 2018. To apply, visit <https://calreach.oshpd.ca.gov>.

***CMSP Designated Counties**

The 35 CMSP participating counties include: Amador, Butte, Calaveras, Colusa, Del Norte, El Dorado, Glenn, Humboldt, Imperial, Inyo, Kings, Lake, Lassen, Madera, Marin, Mariposa, Mendocino, Modoc, Mono, Napa, Nevada, Plumas, San Benito, Shasta, Sierra, Siskiyou, Solano, Sonoma, Sutter, Tehama, Trinity, Tuolumne, Yolo, and Yuba.

Who may apply?

Health Professions Education Foundation is only awarding Allied Healthcare Professionals in CMSP-designated counties, facilities, and professions. To be eligible for the Allied Healthcare Loan Repayment Program, the applicant must be currently licensed and practicing in an Allied Healthcare Profession, which includes the following professions:

- Perfusionist
- Phlebotomist
- Physical Therapy Assistant
- Podiatrist
- Radiotherapist/ Radiation Therapist/
Medical Dosimetrist
- Respiratory Therapist
- Surgical Technologist

In addition, the applicant must:

- Be providing direct patient care 32+ hours or more a week;
- Be in good standing with respective licensure, board or certification;
- Have outstanding educational debt from a commercial or U.S. governmental lending institution;
- Be free from any other service obligation, including other Health Professions Education Foundation programs; and
- Be willing to continue working in a medically underserved area for twelve (12) months.
