### **Advisory Committee Roles and Responsibilities**

- Advise HPEF staff on the development and revision of program applications and selection guidelines.
- Score loan repayment and scholarship program applications for the program. The number of applications varies by program.
- Serve as an ambassador for the program. This includes disseminating information about HPEF to the relevant communities in which you participate through email, social media, etc.
- Assist HPEF staff with marketing and outreach to prospective applicants.
- Advise HPEF staff and Board of Trustees on any issues that may impact the program.
- Assist in the review of program outcomes and provide recommendations for the next scholarship and loan repayment application cycle.
- Participate in at least one advisory committee meeting a year. Agenda topics could include scoring applications, reviewing program outcomes, and providing recommendations for any program improvements.
